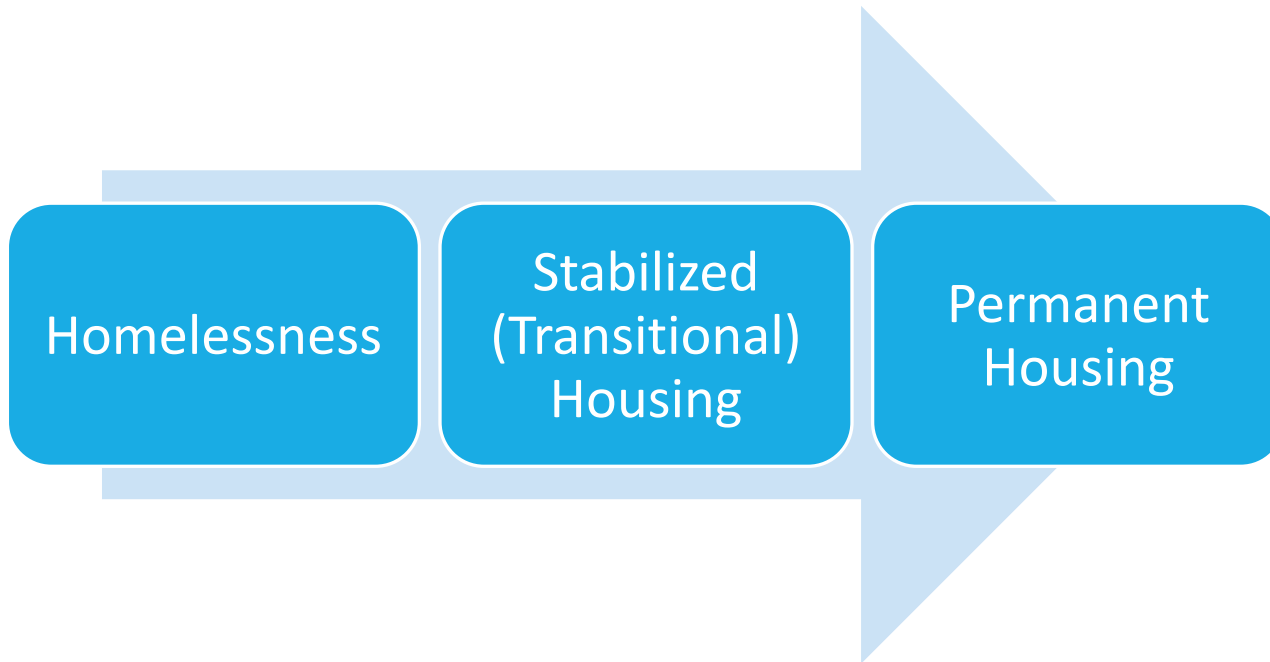

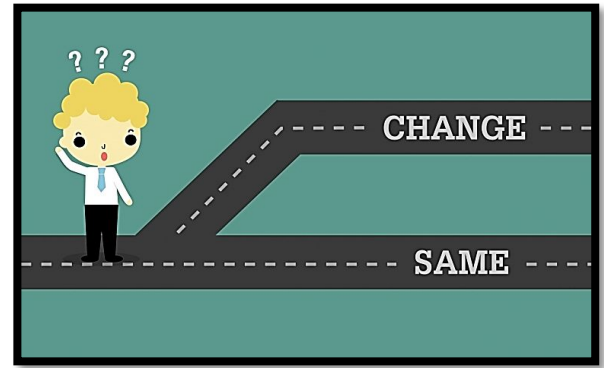

# PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

- Released from Incarceration/DOC Supervision within the Last 12 Months
- Merit-Based Referrals from Community Providers/Social Service Programs, with Criminal Justice Involvement within the last 12 months.
- All Criminal Court Cases must be CLOSED/SENTENCED (2022 Update: Open/Pre-Trial Cases Accepted on Case-by-Case Basis)
- Recently Graduated/Or Set To Graduate Substance Misuse Treatment
- ALL: Genders, Residents/Non-Residents, Populations over 18 years old, State and Federal based convictions.
- DOC Field Supervision, Probation/Parole, Electronic Monitoring
- Willingness to stay in Sober Transitional for a minimum of six months and actively engage in the Reentry Program.

# ENTRY



## #1 COMPLETE APPLICATION, ROI

(Pre-Release Identified: *Submit around 30-45 days prior to Release/Higher Need of Service*)

## #2 MAKE CONTACT WITH PRC

(Email Application, Call for Intake/Screening, Partner Referral, Walk-in)

## #3 INTAKE/HOUSING PLACEMENT

(Participant meets with Assigned Case Manager; goal/case plan, housing placement secured)

## #4 GOALS/Case Management

(Check ins, short/long term goal setting, resources, referrals, treatment/employment/housing support)
